JoAnne Flath is our SEC at MJS. She is a Certified Life Skills Coach and has worked as a counselor in the past. The last couple of years she has been facilitating Life Skills Programs for both organizations and individuals. JoAnne has a passion for helping others, especially in our local area.

6. <u>VIBE</u>

We have a VIBE coach at MJS on Wednesdays- Brooklyn Nelson, is our VIBE coach!

VIBE is one of the Mental Health Capacity Building Programs in the Province. VIBE offers classroom teachers curricular linked mental wellness programming in the area of social emotional learning. All programming is based on research and best practices. All programming can be shared through VIBE's Google Drive. Our programs are geared to students' grades and ages and most programs have a self-regulation component.

Examples of VIBE's programs include: Slumberkins, Building Mental Wellness (BMW), Seven Habits, Hey Warrior, Respect & Responsibility, Friendship, Worry Woos, Kimochis, Study Skills, Healthy Relationships, and many other programs. All programming can be shared upon request through VIBE's Google Drive. VIBE also maintains and distributes a Human Service Directory for parents twice a year. VIBE provides summer programming as well.

For more information about the programs available in your school talk to your classroom teacher or your VIBE Coach Brooklyn Nelson. She is at the school on Wednesdays. If you would like access to a program that your child is receiving, talk to Brooklyn.
